September 25, 2009

Mayor Daniel L. Pillow called the Special Council Meeting to order at 7:00PM. Role call of council; Councilman Jason Fry present, Councilman Ronnie R. Pugh present, Councilman Dan Dalton present, Councilwoman Ann Pillow present, Councilwoman Pam Jackson present and Councilwoman Karen O'Connor present, also present were Village Clerk Margaret Ann Dozier, and Village Solicitor Robert G. Kelly. Also present in the audience were Mr. Gary O'Connor, Mr. Robert Seibert Sr., Mr. Howard Jackson and Mrs. Karen Jackson. Mayor Pillow announced that the sole purpose of the special council meeting was to hear allegations against Mr. Pugh that he is not a resident of the Village of Addyston, Ohio, and that Solicitor Kelly had prepared council with an outline on how the meeting would be conducted, he stated that he had the instructions sent to them and he also had a copy placed before them and hoped that they had ample time to review the outline Mayor Pillow asked who was to speak on behalf of the allegations? Mr. Dalton went to the podium to address the allegations stating that he believed that Mr. Pugh was not a resident of the Village as he had observed the residence of Mr. Pugh for the past ninety days and at different times day or night and no matter what time he drove past Mr. Pugh's alleged his residence vehicle is never parked at alleged residence that he was not ~~stalking~~ Mr. Pugh but believes that Mr. Pugh does not reside in Addyston and that talk on the street leads him to believe that Mr. Pugh does not live in Addyston Mayor Pillow asked Mr. Dalton if he had witnesses that wanted to address council Mr. Dalton stated no and no one came forward. Mayor Pillow asked Mr. Pugh if he wanted to address the charges. Mr. Pugh stated that he wanted to call his first witness Karen Jackson. Mayor Pillow administered the Oath of testimony to Mrs. Jackson. Mr. Pugh asked Mrs. Jackson her relationship to him. Mrs. Jackson stated she was his mother. Mr. Pugh asked if she knew of his residency. Mrs. Jackson replied 312 Main Street, Addyston, Ohio. Mr. Pugh asked how long he has lived there. Mrs. Jackson replied eight years. Mr. Pugh asked if she had any reason to believe that if he left his residency he had intentions of returning to it Mrs. Jackson answered yes. Mr. Pugh made comments upon Mrs. Jackson returning to her seat Mrs. O'Connor asked that Mayor Pillow request that the audience remain silent and not make comments Mayor Pillow asked that the audience remain silent while council conducted its business. Mr. Pugh called Mr. Howard Jackson as his second witness. Mayor Pillow administered the oath of testimony to Mr. Jackson. Mr. Pugh asked Mr. Jackson if he knew where Mr. Pugh's residence was. Mr. Jackson replied yes 312 Main Street, Mr. Pugh asked how long he had been a residence at that address Mr. Jackson replied for 8-9 years ever since he (Mr. Jackson) had purchased the home. Mayor Pillow then asked if there were any other witnesses Mr. Pugh replied himself. Mr. Pugh then went to the podium to address council. Mr. Pugh presented the following documentation that included his residency as 312 Main Street, Addyston, Ohio, his student loans documents, his pay check stubs from his employer Hamilton County, his car loan documents, his health insurance documents from his employer Hamilton County again all bearing the 312 Main Street, Addyston. Mayor Pillow asked if any one else on council had comments on the issue of Mr. Pugh's residency? Mr. Dalton stated that anyone can file a petition with the Hamilton County Board of Elections that they live in Addyston because the HCBE doesn't ask for proof of residency they don't ask to see a driver's license, etc. Mrs. O'Connor that her daughter even though she no longer lives with her but she had the intent to return she so how long is the intent exist? She stated she heard that he lives on West Gate Drive in Cleves with his girlfriend. Mr. Pugh stated that he did purchase a house in Cleves back in 2006 however since that time he filed bankruptcy and no longer owns the house. Mrs. O'Connor stated that she can go to any council member's house to see them, or she will see other council members at the post office or throughout the village but never sees Mr. Pugh. Mr. Fry stated that just recently he had been down to Mr. Pugh's house to talk with him about a council matter, and at that time Mr. Pugh, Mr. Jackson and Mrs. Jackson were there, and he has been to Mr. Pugh's house on other occasions when he was there. Mayor Pillow called on Solicitor Kelly for his comments Solicitor Kelly had nothing to say. Mayor Pillow stated that if council was happy with the information from both persons and if they believed where satisfied then council should vote on the matter.
