

VILLAGE OF ADDYSTON

ORDINANCE NO. 2013-06

AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE THE  
REMOVAL OF DOG AND OTHER ANIMAL EXCREMENT  
WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF ADDYSTON, OHIO

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Addyston, State of Ohio:

WHEREAS, the Village Council has determined there exists a health hazard to residents of the Village as the result of animal owners failing to remove excrement dropped in public places or on private property of owners other than the animal owner; and

WHEREAS, the Village Council has determined it is in the best interest of all Village residents to enact legislation that regulates the removal of animal excrement within the Village; now therefore

SECTION 1. No person shall allow a dog or other animal under his or her control to be upon public property or upon the property of another, absent the consent of the owner or occupant of the property, without some device for the removal and containment of such dog's or other animal's excrement; nor shall any person fail to remove immediately any excrement deposited by any dog or other animal under his or her control on public or private property.

SECTION 2. This section shall not apply to guide dogs under the control of a blind person.


SECTION 3. Whoever violates this section is guilty of a minor misdemeanor.

SECTION 4. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency ordinance and a measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and general welfare and shall go into effect forthwith. The reason for said emergency is the necessity to protect the property rights of residents of the Village and to removal waste injurious to the health of the residents of the Village.
